Trash to Treasure: Innovation with a Purpose

Our school student S. Sarvajith of Class 9 proudly represented the school at the **National Level CBSE Science Exhibition 2025–2026**, held at **Delhi Public School, Delhi**, from **15th January to 17th January 2026**. He presented an innovative project titled **“Trash to Treasure.”** The project strongly highlighted the concept of waste management and sustainability. Sarvajith successfully crafted carbon ink from carbon soot using his own prototype model. This model demonstrated how waste soot can be converted into a useful product. In addition, he prepared dark chocolate using bitter melon seed powder, showcasing the idea of turning agricultural waste into a healthy food product. Before reaching the national level, Sarvajith cleared the regional-level exhibition. **The regional exhibition** was held at **RMK School, Thiruverkadu, Chennai**, on **19th and 20th November 2025**. Many schools from the region participated in this two-day exhibition. Out of more than **450 exhibits**, only **14 top projects** were selected to represent the region at the national level. Sarvajith was proudly one among the selected students. His participation reflects creativity, scientific thinking, and environmental awareness. This achievement has brought great pride and inspiration to our school community.



SCIENTIFIC EXCELLENCE AT THE SOUTHERN INDIA SCIENCE FAIR



S. Sarvajith, a Class 9 student, achieved a proud milestone by securing the 5th prize along with a trophy and cash award at the Southern India Science Fair 2026, held in Hyderabad, Telangana, from **19th to 23rd January 2026**. The fair witnessed participation from six southern states, with over 202 student exhibits showcasing innovative science projects. Sarvajith presented a project titled “Crowd Density Surveillance,” aimed at enhancing public safety by effectively monitoring crowd movement in public places.

Sarvajith’s achievement at the southern level followed consistent success at the regional and state levels. At the regional competition held at Kathirkamam Girls Higher Secondary School, Kathirkamam, Puducherry, he secured 2nd place in the high school category (Classes 9 and 10) among 400 exhibits. At the state-level competition conducted at Sinnatha Girls Higher Secondary School, Muthialpet, Puducherry, he was selected among the top 25 projects (10 group teams and 15 individual students) out of 204 exhibits to represent Puducherry at the Southern India Science Fair.

His project received great appreciation from the judges for its innovation and social relevance, earning him the 5th prize. On 27th January, the Director of School Education, Puducherry, Dr. A. S. Sivakumar, and the Joint Director, Smt. V. G. Sivagami, invited the SISF 2026 prize winners, interacted with them, and congratulated them on their achievements. This accomplishment reflects Sarvajith’s hard work, scientific curiosity, and determination, bringing great pride to his school.
